HOA COMMITTEES

There are several existing, active committees in Tuscany, including Architectural Review, Landscape, Welcome, Social, Finance, Communications, Compliance, and Neighborhood Watch. This month the **Landscaping Committee** is being featured.

Landscaping committee members are Narmada Balaji (chairperson), Patricia Gaggi, Bala Shankar, Anand Gudaru, and Cheryl Burrell.

The role of the Landscaping Committee is to promote and preserve the established look and feel of the overall community landscaping plan and standards of the community as it pertains to both homeowner and common properties.

<u>Duties</u>: review the landscaping contract to understand current responsibilities and costs; review Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for new maintenance contracts; make suggestions on ways to help our community grow more beautiful while keeping costs within the budget and maintaining the consistent look of the community.

A MESSAGE from the committee to homeowners/tenant residents:

The landscape committee is an advisory committee with any final decisions resting solely with the HOA Board. The committee helps the Board by being in touch with the pulse of the community regarding landscaping needs and sends their recommendations to the Board based on input from homeowners. We work with the Board to create and publish the "Landscape Responsibilities" document on the HOA website, participate in meetings with Nature Coast to discuss contract details, and manage complaints as well as desired improvements. These are a few ways we have contributed to our community in the past.

The Landscape Committee is a work in progress, and it would greatly help if homeowners would vigorously maintain their yards with regular upkeep like weeding, removing dead plants/shrubs, trimming existing plants as needed, etc. A weekly walk around the yard to check for any large dried-up patches of sod will help catch irrigation problems at their earliest and can be conveyed to the management company to get any problems fixed.

But, most importantly, we need homeowners to be aware of the fact that landscaping changes including removal of trees, adding rocks to landscaped beds, expanding original landscaped beds, etc., are akin to structural and architectural changes and need prior approval from McNeil Management and the HOA Board.

<u>Remember</u>: Read the Tuscany deed restrictions first and . . . "When in doubt, stop email <u>management@mcneilmsi.com</u>."

WATER USE RESTRICTIONS

As we have had rain only once or twice in over a month, some lawns are beginning to show distress and need to be watered. Please turn your irrigation system ON until the rainy season begins, but remember to observe the following City of Tampa watering guidelines.

The following City of Tampa water use restrictions have been in effect since August 1, 2017. Please read carefully, check/set sprinkler systems appropriately.

Year-Round Watering Days

- At addresses ending in 0, 1, 2 or 3 Mondays and Thursdays
- At addresses ending in 4, 5, or 6 Tuesdays and Fridays
- At addresses ending in 7, 8 or 9 Wednesdays and Saturdays
- Irrigation is permitted between midnight and 8 a.m. OR between 6 p.m. and midnight on the allowed days.
- Restrictions remain in place for irrigation of new and established landscapes, chemical treatments and irrigation system maintenance. Low-volume micro-irrigation, hand watering, car washing, fountain operation and power washing are unrestricted.
- The watering day allowances apply to all permanent, in-ground, automatic and manual irrigation systems and when using a garden hose with a portable hose-end sprinkler. Irrigation is not permitted between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the allowed day.
- These restrictions apply to all water sources except <u>reclaimed</u> water.

The Tampa Water Department publishes updates and changes to local water restrictions in these ways: media releases, <u>Alert Tampa</u> notification, NextDoor, and utility customer billing inserts. Water use restrictions are in place year-round and affect all water sources, including wells. **Violating water use restrictions in Tampa may result in penalties ranging from \$100 to \$450 and a mandatory court appearance.** Restrictions are subject to change in response to local and regional water supply conditions.
