YARD GARDENS OF THE MONTH

Some of the plants included in their colorful and neatly maintained pots and garden beds are rosemary, ilex, petunias, purslane, liriope, purple salvia, hydrangea, sweet alyssum, and bougainvillea. Several homeowners took advantage of the cooler spring weather in March and April to spruce up their landscaped beds. The geraniums, vinca periwinkles, roses, and gladioli in Nirmal Shrestha's front garden are an example of adding color to accent the greenery in a garden bed.

BEWARE OF ALLIGATORS

Don't feed the alligators, and don't try to take up-close selfies with them — and for goodness' sake, watch your pets around the ponds in our neighborhood.

The following information is issued by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission as simple strategies for living alongside the state's 1.3 million alligators, which are found in all 67 Florida counties.

With warmer months approaching, alligator sightings are expected to go up as they become more active. Early April is when alligator courtship begins with mating season in May and June. Eggs are hatched from mid-August to early September. Alligators are also basking in the sun to help regulate their body temperature, thereby increasing the number seen on pond and river banks, the Florida Wildlife Commission says.

Those sightings lead to an average of 16,000 alligator complaints each year. Most involve gators found in canals, streams, and ponds. But sometimes a gator wanders into someone's garage, meanders through a golf course, or knocks at front doors.

That increased presence has FWC officials reminding people not to feed the gators. It's not only dangerous but illegal too, they say. "When fed, alligators can overcome their natural wariness and learn to associate people with food," Sapp said. Along with not tossing scraps to the gators, the FWC wants to have pet owners keep their pets on a leash so they don't become a quick meal.

MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST FOR FLORIDA HOMES

April showers bring May flowers . . . and probably <u>weeds</u>, too, so get ready to inspect your garden beds and banish the weeds before they grow taller than your children.

If your driveway, walkway, and front porch are surfaced with **pavers**, please (before you receive a violation notice) have them pressure washed, filled with sand to avoid uneven settlement or potential cracking, and possibly sealed for additional protection from mold, mildew, and weeds that the summer rains invariably bring. If you have weeds growing between the pavers, please spray them with a weed killer product to keep your driveway looking neat.

Inspect the <u>stucco</u> surfaces of your home to check for cracks. A porous material, stucco collects dirt, absorbs stains, and can crack. Ignoring the condition of your home's stucco siding can lead not only to further degradation of the stucco, but also to a host of nasty issues— mold growth, for example, or pest infestations. Don't give a minor crack the chance to become a major headache. Take swift action. Get cracks filled and sealed.

Do a clean-out of **gutters** if your home has them so rainfall will flow unimpeded to the ground.

Oil <u>garage door</u> rollers and springs to prevent the experience of having the garage door fail to open or close properly.

Clear <u>vegetation</u> away from the house foundation to prevent water intrusion and to keep unwanted bugs from finding their way indoors.

Check for **plumbing** leaks under sinks, around toilets, and at exterior faucets.

Have the <u>HVAC system</u> serviced so it doesn't fail you during the coming months of 90-degree daily temperatures.

Flush the water heater so sediment doesn't build up inside it.

Replace **smoke detector** batteries.

Inspect **ceilings** in the house and garage for water leaks.

If <u>roof shingles</u> are discolored due to mold and mildew accumulation, call a professional to get your roof cleaned (before a violation notice is issued).

Bringing a gas line to your home does not require that your change your home's appliances right away. It just provides an optional utility when/if you decide to convert your stove or water heater, for example, from electric to natural gas.

You can print and complete the form and drop it off to Azfar Mujtaba at 7807 Tuscany Woods Drive so that all forms can be presented to Peoples Gas at the same time.

<u>NOTE</u>: This is not a commitment to install and pay for a gas line to your home. It is simply a survey to gauge the amount of interest residents have in presenting Peoples Gas with a sufficient justification to install gas lines from Tampa Palms Boulevard into individual homes in Tuscany.
